Despite the unique challenges of this season, The Warren Alpert Medical School brought in a record number of applications and can look forward to another highly talented and altruistic class. On August 2, we welcomed 144 new students to the MD Class of 2025, coming from 62 different undergraduate institutions, 34 U.S. States, and with 19 other countries represented by birth or citizenship. 33% of the incoming class come from groups underrepresented in medicine. The Primary Care and Population Medicine Program recruited its targeted number of 16 students. Three students will be entering our MD/PhD Program, now supporting 18 physician-scientists, and expected to expand to 24 over time. Fifteen students have already completed advanced degrees, including Fulbright and Goldwater scholars and an Albright Fellow. Seven MD'25 students have served in the military. Many have published research. Others have worked as birth doulas, EMTs and CNAs, and with NASA, AmeriCorps, the Peace Corps, Doctors of Tomorrow, the National Institutes of Health, and clinics and community outreach programs in the United States and abroad. We welcome a comedy writer, a boxer, and many dancers, singers, musicians, and award-winning athletes.
